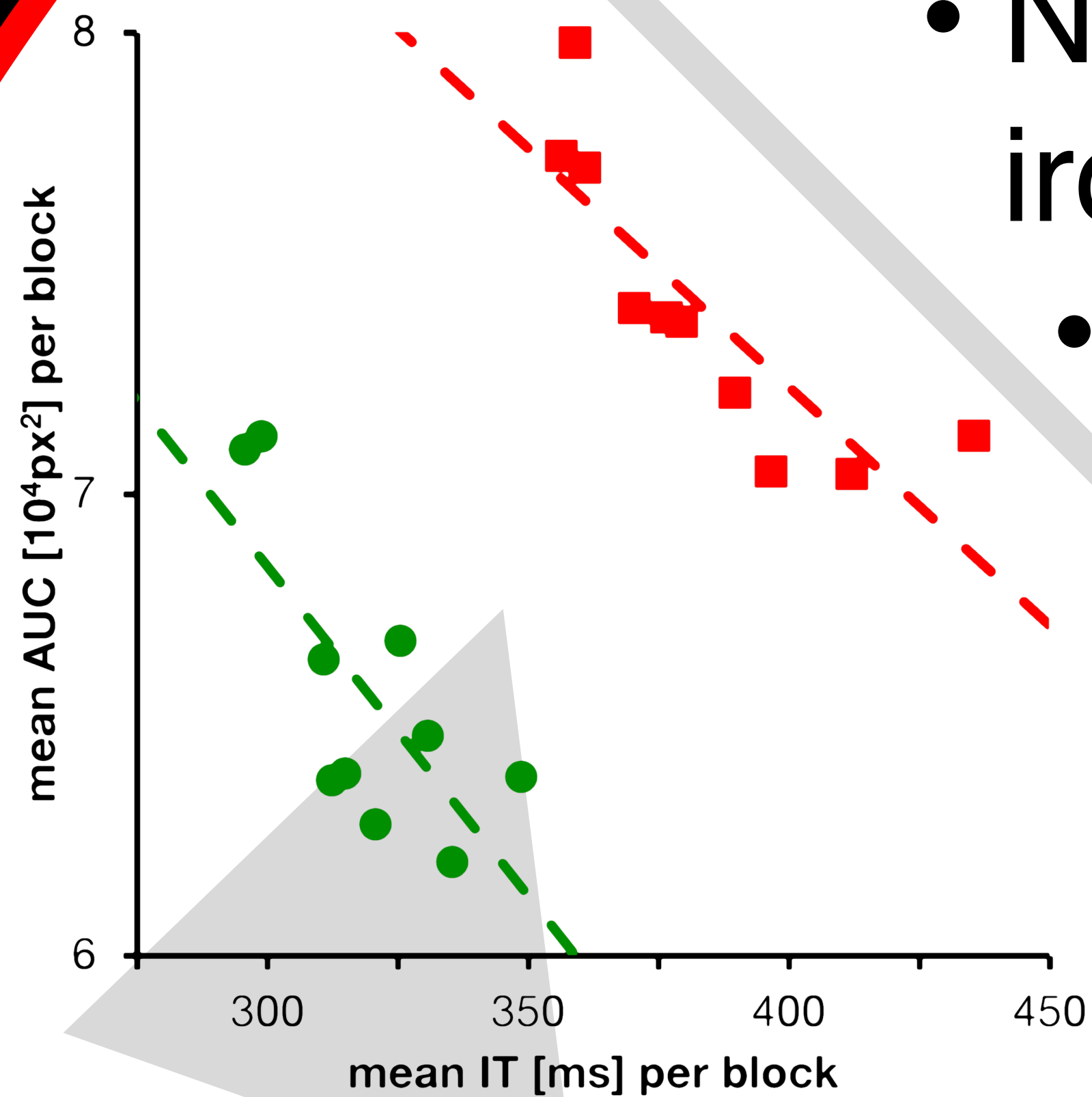


FOLLOWING AFFIRMATIVE AND NEGATED RULES



- Rules are often stated in a negated rather than affirmative manner.
- Negations produce conflict and ironic effects.
 - Are affirmative and negated rules put into action differently?



- With practice, action planning (IT) improves, but at the cost of movement efficiency (AUC).
- Spatio-temporal tradeoff, no real improvement.
 - Hard-wired costs for negations.
